Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005– Screening Determination West Dunbartonshire Council – Contaminated Land Strategy

In accordance with section 8(1) of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 a SEA Screening Report was submitted to the Scottish Government SEA Gateway on 24 September 2013 to set out the views of West Dunbartonshire Council (WDC) as the Responsible Authority for their proposed Contaminated Land Strategy on the likelihood of the PPS having significant environmental effects and therefore the potential for the PPS to require SEA. WDC consulted with Historic Scotland, Scottish Environment Protection Agency and Scottish Natural Heritage on the proposed Contaminated Land Strategy and their responses were submitted to the SEA gateway on 22 October 2013. A screening determination is enclosed with this letter.

Based on the aforementioned screening report and consultation responses it is the view of WDC that a SEA is not required. This determination has been further expanded upon within the screening determination.

West Dunbartonshire Council shall publicise the screening determination through an advert placed in the Clydebank Post and at www.west-dunbarton.gov.uk within 14 days of the date on the determination.

The Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005

Screening Determination under Section 8(1)

West Dunbartonshire Council (WDC) has undertaken a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) Screening of their Contaminated Land Strategy. This document is a summary of the SEA Screening procedure undertaken by WDC (as per the requirements of Section 9(1) of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005) that has informed the determination of SEA requirement.

It is WDC's view that under Section 8(1) of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act (2005), the Contaminated Land Strategy is unlikely to have significant environmental effects and therefore a SEA is not required.

Prior to making the determination that a SEA was not required, the Screening Report was reviewed by the Statutory Consultation Authorities for SEA listed below:

- Scottish Natural Heritage (SNH);
- Scottish Environment Protection Agency (SEPA); and
- Historic Scotland.

In agreement with WDC, it is the opinion of all three Consultation Authorities that any significant environmental effects are unlikely as a result of implementing the Contaminated Land Strategy and therefore a SEA is not required.

A Strategic Environmental Assessment will therefore not be prepared alongside the Contaminated Land Strategy.
