West Dunbartonshire Council has a population of 89,730.





West Dunbartonshire comparisons with Scotland

Women in West Dunbartonshire live, on average, four years longer than men and can expect to have almost two more years of healthy life expectancy than men. The estimates of both male and female life expectancy in West Dunbartonshire are lower than the Scotland average. The difference between healthy life expectancy and overall life expectancy gives a measure of life lived not in good health, which is 15.6 years for men and 18.1 years for women. The proportion of the population aged 65 years and over is lower than in Scotland as a whole. The area has a higher than average proportion of people in income deprivation (19%) and a higher than average proportion of children living in poverty (24%). 6% of households are privately rented, much lower than the Scottish average. 62% of people live within 500m of derelict land, much higher than the Scottish average.









Life expectancy in West Dunbartonshire has risen by 4 years for men but only by 1.5 years from women in the last 14 years. In the most recent period shown, male and female life expectancy were both slightly lower than the Scottish average.





The overall population in West Dunbartonshire declined by 4% between 2001 and 2014, with the largest decrease being in the number of children under 16 years - a decrease of 12%, followed by a decrease of 11.5% in the number of adults between 16 and 44. West Dunbartonshire has a lower proportion of adults with qualifications at Higher level or above than Scotland as a whole and has a lower proportion of people in employment.

Notes

- 1. Data sources: Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) 2012, Census 2011, Census 2001, Child Poverty Unit, NOMIS, National Records of Scotland (NRS) and Scottish Government.
- 2. Populations presented in the population trend chart and used to calculate life expectancy estimates are taken from NRS small area population estimates and are based on: the 2001 census for the years 1996-2001; both the 2001 and 2011 census for the years 2002-2010; and the 2011 census for the years 2011-2014.
- 3. The Income deprivation indicator is derived from SIMD 2012, more information on this deprivation index can be found at: http://simd.scotland.gov.uk/publication-2012
- 4. Life expectancies are calculated based on population estimates and death registrations. 95% confidence intervals have been added on the graphs to give an indication of their accuracy. The x-axes of the life expectancy graphs give the mid-year for each life expectancy estimate e.g. the most recent estimate, denoted by 2012 represents the life expectancy estimate for the period 2010 2014.
