The Green Infrastructure Strategic Intervention is a major new Scottish programme of investment, led by Scottish Natural Heritage (SNH), which will green our larger towns and cities.

SNH has approved funding of up to £620,000 to help transform the site of the former St Eunan's Primary School in Clydebank into a community green space area. West Dunbartonshire Council had already approved funding of £900,000 for the project and is now working together with SNH to develop and deliver this new Community Green Space.
