

Key Construction Issues and Approach - Material Deliveries

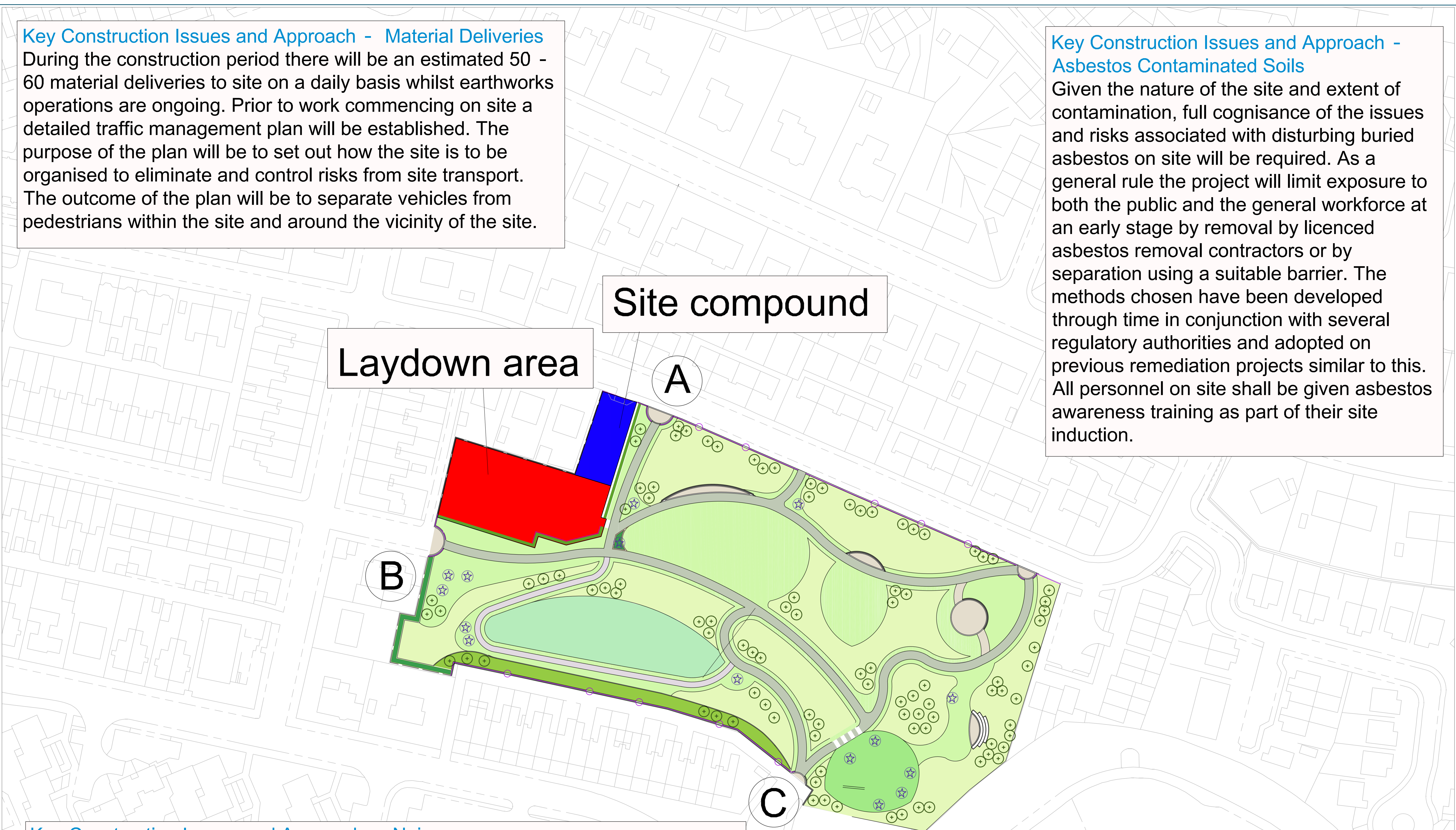
During the construction period there will be an estimated 50 - 60 material deliveries to site on a daily basis whilst earthworks operations are ongoing. Prior to work commencing on site a detailed traffic management plan will be established. The purpose of the plan will be to set out how the site is to be organised to eliminate and control risks from site transport. The outcome of the plan will be to separate vehicles from pedestrians within the site and around the vicinity of the site.

Key Construction Issues and Approach - Asbestos Contaminated Soils

Given the nature of the site and extent of contamination, full cognisance of the issues and risks associated with disturbing buried asbestos on site will be required. As a general rule the project will limit exposure to both the public and the general workforce at an early stage by removal by licenced asbestos removal contractors or by separation using a suitable barrier. The methods chosen have been developed through time in conjunction with several regulatory authorities and adopted on previous remediation projects similar to this. All personnel on site shall be given asbestos awareness training as part of their site induction.

Key Construction Issues and Approach - Noise

Robertson are mindful of the disruptive affect that excessively noisy operations can have on the occupants of adjacent areas and property and accordingly the Project Team will ensure that all work will be carried out in accordance with current Noise at Work Regulations.

Key Construction Issues and Approach - Dust

Notwithstanding the potential spread of contamination Robertson are mindful of the nuisance that dust can have on the occupants of adjacent areas and property and accordingly the Project Team will ensure that suitable controls are in place to manage this.

Key Construction Issues and Approach - Adjacent land users

For Robertson Construction one of the key priorities on all projects is to ensure all parties fully understand the issues affecting the delivery of the project. On this project it will encompass representatives from:
