- For children and young people who have experienced Rape, Sexual assault and Sexual Abuse

Abuse is totally unacceptable. All children, young people and women have a right to live their lives free from violence, abuse, intimidation and fear.

### Recognising Abuse





Domestic abuse against women means being frightened or intimidated and can be perpetrated by partners or ex partners. Abuse is about power and control and can be both subtle and blatant. This comes in different forms including emotional, sexual, psychological, financial as well as physical abuse.

Children and young people are exposed to and directly experience much of this abuse. Their experience of abuse might include:

- Overhearing or witnessing the abuse
- Being forced to watch or participate in the abuse
- Intervening to protect the mother and siblings
- Being blamed for the abuse
- Possessions destroyed
- Pets being hurt
- Being told not to tell
- Leaving friends, relatives, home and school

#### Sexual Abuse

Rape, sexual abuse and sexual assault is always wrong and is about the misuse of power and control. Domestic abuse and other forms of gender based violence may lead to feelings of fear, guilt, anger, anxiety, helplessness and isolation. This can impact on all aspects of children and young people's lives including their mental and physical health, relationships, behaviour and cause disruption to schooling.



CARA offers the following services to children and young people of school age

- Practical short term support, advocacy and information
- Person centred counselling
- Someone to talk to in confidence
- Help with Safety Planning
- Access to other relevant services
- Support may be negotiated for young men up to 18 years who have been affected by domestic abuse.
- Appointments may take place in settings including schools, social work, GP practices and any youth settings across West Dunbartonshire
