

Strategic Infrastructure Development, Bowling

Q2 Newsletter, July 2025

A major industrial and commercial site at the former ExxonMobil oil terminal in Bowling is starting to take shape with site clearance nearing completion.

The site is being transformed to unlock the potential of mixed-use development including storage, distribution, industrial, business and office space. It is a joint investment project between West Dunbartonshire Council and Glasgow City Region City Deal with funding from both UK and Scottish Governments.

The site is expected to bring £20.6 million of additional private investment and £331.4m net additional Gross Value Added to the City Region over 25 years.

The project includes the reconfiguration of Dumbuck junction on the A82/ A814, the construction of a new railway underbridge, partial reconstruction of an existing railway overbridge, 2.2km of spine roads and the phased implementation of raised platforms ready for development of future buildings on the site. Of the 150-acre area, 47 acres are planned for development, with green network and green infrastructure enhancements including a waterfront pedestrian and cycle path being developed.

In addition, a heritage area has been identified around listed structure Dunglass Castle.



Project Updates:

Western Junction



A critical element of the works within the new junction is the utility diversions which are key to releasing areas for follow on construction works. These include multiple Scottish Water diversions and an intermediate pressure gas main diversion. Operations are progressing well and allowing earthworks to commence. This will lead to the construction of new carriageway embankments. There will also be two new structures/underpasses that will accommodate vehicles entering and exiting the junction, with cyclists and pedestrians below within a shared cycleway footpath.

Project Updates:

Spine Road

The spine road is a vital component of the overall infrastructure strategy, designed to provide essential internal connectivity across the site. It will serve as the main access route for future development plots, and enable efficient movement of vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists. It will also link key junctions and support the phased delivery of commercial and industrial spaces, unlocking the full potential of the site.







Significant progress has been made with the formation of the new spine road embankment. Over 200,000 tonnes of imported material will form the road corridor, creating a stable foundation for future surfacing and utility installations. This milestone marks a major step forward in preparing the site for long-term development and investment.









Unlocking Regeneration: Rail Underbridge

Scotland's Railway is supporting the Council to transform and unlock the potential of the 150-acre strategic infrastructure site.

Network Rail are undertaking a £5.9m project including the development of a new bridge under the railway which will open the site access for mixed-use development featuring storage, distribution, industrial, business and office space.

The rail underbridge, allowing the development of a new access road across the site, is a key element of the £34m Glasgow City Region City Deal project. It will improve connectivity, and support local economic growth and development, environmental and social success.

The construction of the underbridge will be managed by Network Rail Scotland, ensuring minimal disruption to local communities, Scotland's Railway and its passengers.



Work by is well underway by the Network Rail team, with engineers clearing approximately 80,000 tonnes of earth to date in preparation for broader work across the summer.

Network Rail Scotland Project Manager, Laura Craig, said: "At Scotland's Railway we connect communities and support economic, social and environmental success. This £5.9m project is key to transforming and unlocking the potential of the site.

Project Updates: Future Works



- **1.West Junction:** Ongoing utility diversions will allow proposed earthworks operations and installation of drainage.
- 2. Rail Underbridge: Development of a new bridge under the railway.
- **3. Spine Road and East Junction (Dunglass):** Bulk material fill for earthworks embankments, along with localised earthworks to the east junction, adjacent to the A814.
- **4. A82 Dunglass Roundabout:** Realignment of kerb lines and drainage adjacent to Dunglass Roundabout.

Traffic Management:

Traffic management will be carefully planned and coordinated between the Project Team, Transport Scotland and the Council's Roads Department. We understand how important being able to use the road network with minimal disruption is, therefore, every effort will be made to reduce the impact on road users.
