# Photography Policy



WD Leisure appreciates that customers may wish to capture special moments in family life, and this may include events in our facilities like baby's first swim or your child's birthday party.

We are happy to allow customers to record these special moments, however we need to control the use of photographic or recording equipment (including cameras, mobile phones, tablets, or other hand held or wearable devices) to ensure that no inappropriate photography or filming takes place in our facilities and programmes.

## Photography may be permitted in the following areas, subject to permission

- ✓ Swimming Pools
- ✓ Sports Halls
- ✓ Circulation Areas

### The following conditions must be met:

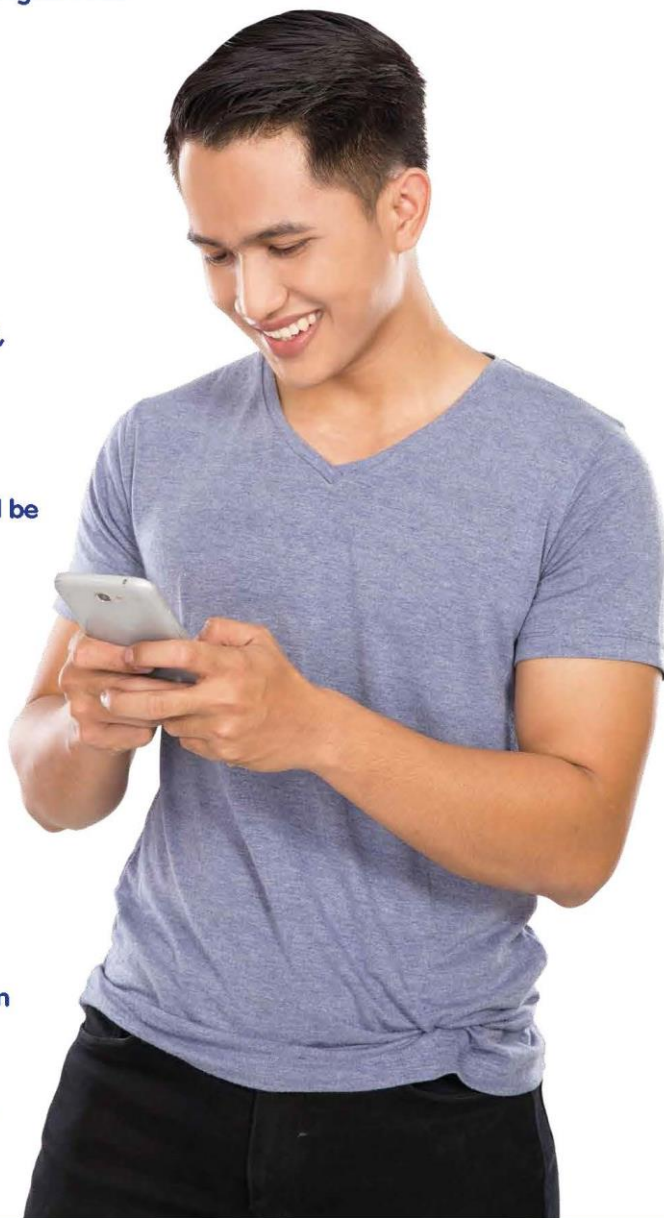
- There is a relationship between the photographer and subject(s), eg. family/friends or a professional photographer registered with WD Leisure for a specific event
- All those being photographed have given consent
- The photograph can be taken ensuring that no other person will be included in the background, without that person's consent
- Consent of a parent/guardian is given for children under 12 years and for vulnerable adults

## Photography is permitted in the following areas, with no permission required

- ✓ Gyms
- ✓ Group Fitness Studios
- ✓ Meeting Rooms
- ✓ Birthday Parties (except swimming pool parties – permission required)

Where any customer or WDL employee complains or expresses concern regarding the use of any photographic or recording equipment, permission will be immediately withdrawn.

Consent is not required for public events where there is no reasonable expectation of privacy, eg. football tournaments, swimming galas, boxing matches, etc.



## Situations where photography is absolutely forbidden

Photography will not be permitted where there is a reasonable expectation of privacy, eg. in:

- × Health Suites
- × Changing Areas
- × Toilet / Shower Areas
